For example, a member of staff based in the computing service takes a group of engineering students for a lecture and is paid for under a servicing agreement by the engineering department, then the cost centre returned should be 'General Engineering' (16).

The most important consideration in taking decisions about the attribution of students to cost centres should be the correspondence with the Finance record.

Where a part of the programme of study is taught other than by the reporting institution, expenditure related to this provision must be included against academic cost centres under Head 1 of Table 6 of the Finance Record. It has been agreed that the cost centres used on the Student Record should match this allocation, i.e. institutions should normally code cost centre according to the organising department at their institution. However, where the franchised out activity would constitute more than 20% of the organising department's student FTE, and the activity does not fit within the same cost centre as the organising department, then the activity and associated expenditure should be reported against the cost centre that most closely matches the academic content of the franchised out provision. Code 99 'Cost centre not assignable' should be used only in cases where it is not possible to allocate the activity to an academic cost centre e.g. where the appropriate cost centre is a non-academic cost centre. For institutions in England, HEFCE intend to make use of cost centres in their funding allocations. As such HEFCE have indicated that provision returned under code 99 'Cost centre not assignable' will be allocated to the lowest price group for funding.

Changes to Cost Centres

Following from the recent review of the HESA Finance Record it was agreed that a simplification of the current list of cost centres was required, achieved by merging or removing existing cost centres.

To this end a pattern of cost centres has been finalised that strikes a good balance between being simple and providing a rich presentation of information. The changes are summarised in Cost Centres Summary.

It is obviously necessary to implement the cost centre changes across the full range of HESA data streams. For the 2004/05 Student Record, institutions are encouraged to use the new shorter list of cost centres, but where this might present difficulties, institutions can in 2004/05 continue to use the existing fuller list of cost centres. During such transition HESA will undertake appropriate amalgamation before onward use of the data. From 2005/06 onwards, validation will prevent the use of the "old" cost centre list.

- **EXAMPLE** An applied physics module may be taught 80% in the physics cost centre and 20% in the information technology and systems sciences cost centre. This could be coded as follows:

	The Cost centre is a two digit number indicating the academic cost centre in which the subject is being taught. It is up to institutions to decide whether or not to return details of cost centres which are contributing teaching/learning amounting to less than 5% of the proportion of the module.
	For institutions in Scotland up to four cost centres may be returned with input to the current year of the module, identifying the main subject areas and the proportion of input of each.
NOTES	Field 21, Cost centre 3, is linked to field 22, Subject area of study 3, and field 23, Proportion of subject 3.

Changes to Cost Centres

Following from the recent review of the HESA Finance Record it was agreed that a simplification of the current list of cost centres was required, achieved by merging or removing existing cost centres.

To this end a pattern of cost centres has been finalised that strikes a good balance between being simple and providing a rich presentation of information. The changes are summarised in Co st Centres Summary.

It is obviously necessary to implement the cost centre changes across the full range of HESA data streams. For the 2004/05 Student Record, institutions are encouraged to use the new shorter list of cost centres, but where this might present difficulties, institutions can in 2004/05 continue to use the existing fuller list of cost centres. During such transition HESA will undertake appropriate amalgamation before onward use of the data. From 2005/06 onwards, validation will prevent the use of the "old" cost centre list.
